## Preparation Camp

**Purpose:** To bring the selected team, including the alternates, together to hold a mock meet and to finalize preparations for the games.

**Attendees:** Mandatory for selected athletes (including alternates), team coach and team manager. TBC if interested personal coaches of athletes on the team may also attend.

**Cost:** the majority – or all – of the travel and accommodation costs of the named team including alternates will be covered by Gymnastics BC. Personal coaches will be self-funded if they choose to attend the camp. Personal coaches will not be accredited for the event. A finalized funding structure will be shared when available.

## Eligibility

### Athlete

- Born 2005–2013.
- Registered athlete in good standing with Gymnastics BC.
- Level 5 or higher
- Take part in all mandatory activities of the Canada Games Preparation Plan.
- Refer to the [Canada Games Technical Package](#) for full eligibility criteria.

Two male athletes and two female athletes will be named to the team, along with one non-traveling alternate per gender. The synchro team will be comprised of the two athletes named to the team. No additional competitors will be selected.

### Staff / Coaches

Refer to the TG [Canada Games Technical Package](#) for full eligibility criteria.

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- Must be Level 3 Certified in Trampoline, OR Competition 3 (Development) Certified in Trampoline. Must be certified no later than **90 days before the Opening Ceremonies** of the games (November 29<sup>th</sup>, 2026).
- Meet Screening/Course requirements \*additional CGC, GymBC and/or Canada Games requirements may be added\*
  - Respect in Sport Online E-learning module
  - TrueSport Clean 101 e-learning
  - CAC Making Headway Online learning Module
  - Updated enhanced Background Check (valid within 12mo of completion)
- Be a registered coach in good standing with Gymnastics BC
- Be willing to take part in a leadership role in all activities of the Canada Games Preparation plan
- Clubs with selected athletes participating in the games must be prepared to have one coach attend the games. In the event a coach from that club is unavailable, they must be prepared to appoint a suitable replacement.

## Selection Process

### Purpose

To identify and select the athletes and coaches best capable of ensuring, or exceeding, the achievement of the performance objectives of the 2027 Canada Games.

### Performance Objectives

To achieve podium finishes in all three events: Individual, Synchro, and Team.

### Selection of the Team Athletes & Alternate

The two male athletes and two female athletes will be selected to Team BC after the designated BC trial events. The two best single voluntary preliminary scores, and the best final score from either trial will be used in selection.

In the event of a tie after both trials:

1. The athlete with the higher T-score prevails;
2. The athlete with the higher H-score prevails;
3. The athlete with the higher D-score prevails;
4. The athlete with the higher E-score prevails

If there is still a tie, priority will be given as follows:

- 1). Senior athletes (NOT attending World Championships)
- 2). Development National Team Athletes ranked top four (4) as of September 2026
- 3). Junior National Team athletes ranked top four (4) as of September 2026

The highest ranked male not named to the team will be the alternate for the men's team. The highest ranked female not named to the team will be the alternate for the women's team.

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### Staff Selection

The coaching staff is composed of:

- One head coach
- One assistant coach (may act as a team manager)
- One of the coaching staff members must be male and one must be female.

The head coach and assistant coaches will be selected using the following criteria,

- Working in the best interest of the team
- Past experience leading a team at a national event (preferred)
- Clubs can only put a coach nomination forward if they have an athlete who has been selected for the team.
- Club ranking points – clubs with the most points are able to select a male or a female coach.
- Number of their athletes on the team
- May be asked to act as the Team Manager
- Able to meet the spotting needs of athletes on the team
- Ability to adhere to Gymnastics BC's team objectives and policies

### Head Coach Selection

The club having earned the highest **COMBINED** points (top 2 women / top 2 men following Trials #2) will have the authority to submit the name of its coach to Gymnastics BC for final eligibility confirmation to the Head Coach position. The named coach must be the primary or secondary/assistant coach of the athlete(s) on the team.

Points will be determined as follows:

- Athlete in 1<sup>st</sup> place: 10 points
- Athlete in 2<sup>nd</sup> place: 5 points
- Tiebreak #1: Athlete's national team seniority will be considered
- Tiebreak #2: 1<sup>st</sup> alternate's club will be awarded 3pts
- Tiebreak #3: 2<sup>nd</sup> alternate's club will be awarded 1pt
- Tiebreak #4: upon submission of a resume and cover letter, the Gymnastics BC Technical Sub-Committee (Program Manager, Judging Chair, Provincial Performance Advisor) will select the coach. These sub-committee members do not have any direct affiliation/conflicts with the trampoline community.

The CWG Head Coach will be allocated by club and not by individual coach. The Gymnastic BC Technical Committee must ratify the name of the selected coach and will only consider someone who has been a coach at least one (1) Canadian Championships or Elite Canada.

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### Assistant Coach

The assistant coach position will be selected from the club with the second highest COMBINED (top 2 women / top 2 men) of points from Trials #1 and Trials #2. The following will be considered when choosing the assistant;

- Female/male coaching requirements
- Spotting needs of the team
- Athlete ranking points
- Number of athletes on the team
- Past experience leading a team at a national event
- Punctuality and attention to detail
- Ability to adhere to Gymnastics BC's team objectives and policies

If the identified club is unable to nominate a coach AND/OR meet the gender requirements, as the Assistant coach, the nomination will be awarded to the club with the highest total number of points from only Trials 2.

### Removal or Substitution of a Coach

Before departure, the Gymnastics BC Program Manager, in consultation with the technical committee, may remove a coach or substitute a coach with another coach from the same club, in the event that a coach:

- Is not in attendance at every preparation camp;
- Is not meeting the expectations associated with their roles, responsibilities, and tasks during training camps, or any other identified activity;
- No longer has an athlete on the team; or
- Is no longer meeting GCG or GBC SafeSport requirements.

If there is no coach available from the same club, or, if the removed coach is unable to appoint a suitable replacement, the next ranking club will be used.

### Petition Process

Should an athlete, coach, or manager be unable to attend or participate to conclusion at any of the trials, camps or other mandatory activities, they may submit the petition form to Gymnastics BC.

Following the submission of the form, it will be forwarded to the technical committee for review. Upon receipt of the first petition form, a sub-committee of three (3) members of the trampoline technical committee with no conflicts of interest to the involved parties will then be struck (Judging Chair, Gymnastics BC Program Manager, Provincial Performance Advisor). The Chair of the technical committee will not be appointed unless they are the last person with no conflict of interest. Should there not be enough non-conflicting members available, a non-conflicted National or FIG Judge from the respective discipline will be appointed. A vote of majority will prevail in all cases.

Conflicts of Interest include, but are not limited to,

- Personal coach of athlete
- Coach with athlete(s) in the selection pool for Canada Winter Games
- Coach at the same club of athlete
- Past coach of the athlete
- Relative of the athlete

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Petitions are to be submitted in a timely manner. They will be accepted up until the end of Trial #2. No petitions will be accepted after Trial #2 under any circumstances.

### **Naming of the Team**

Following Trial #2, an unofficial team will be named (athletes and coach). The team will then be officially named within one (1) week following the closing of the appeal period, after ratification by the respective disciplines technical committee.

### **Appeal Process**

Within five (5) calendar days following the unofficial team announcement or before **February 1, 2027** -whichever comes first – and before the official team announcements, appeals may be submitted to Gymnastics BC in writing to the Trampoline Program Manager.

Appeals will only be considered if the selection of an athlete or coach was found to be based on false or flawed information.

Appeals will be handled by a sub-committee made up the three technical committee members, as listed in the event of a petition, unless a conflict of interest arises. No member of this sub-committee may have been involved in the petition process. In the case of a conflict of interest, another member of that disciplines technical committee with no conflict of interest will be appointed. Their majority vote would reject or uphold any bonafide appeal.



## Appendix A – Staff Roles & Responsibilities

### 1. Responsibilities

- Abide by the GBC Code of Conduct
- Abide by all Team BC, TG Code of Points, Canada Games policies and procedures, and Canada Games Technical Handbook
- Attend all meetings organized by Team BC
- Attend all Canada Games functions, as required
- Contribute to positive team cohesion and enthusiastic team spirit
- Follow the requirements outlined by Team BC in cooperation with the coaches and technical staff
- Communicate information from team meetings
- Review the content of all athlete meetings and have written information regarding athlete routines. Be familiar with training habits of athletes on the team and be prepared to address athlete needs/habits - *Coach*
- Liaise with Canada Winter Games mission staff – *Team Manager*
- Assist in coordinating and organizing identified Canada Winter Games activities (training camps, sport medicine, and other as required by Team BC) – *Team Manager*
- Coordinate the collection of information, forms or other required documents by Team BC – *Team Manager*
- Assist with competition clothing and track suit sizing and distribution of Team BC clothing. – *Team Manager*
- Attend/be available for media events on behalf of Team BC.

### 2. During the Games

- Attend to relevant needs of the athletes
- Assisting the team coach and coaching the athletes during training and competition
- Ensure all on-site scheduling, including lunch boxes, medical appointments, discipline problems, curfews, adherence to curfews and any other tasks required by Team BC – *Team Manager*
- Organize and participate in non-gymnastics activity with athletes once the competition is completed

### 3. After the Games

- Submit a report to GBC within ten (10) days of returning from the games
- Ensure that the team coach submits their report to GBC
